

Congratulations to BA Hons Fine Art students Tara Mayo, Rebecca Foster-Clarke and Ellen Sibley who were shortlisted for the annual Norfolk Contemporary Art Society ncas Prize.

Generously awarded each year by members of the **ncas** Committee, the prize of £500 is presented to a graduating Fine Art student who has excelled in their studies and demonstrated this in the presentation of an outstanding final exhibition.

After viewing the NUA Graduation Showcase and End of Year Publication, the **ncas** Committee selected Tara Mayo as the 2021 prize-winner. The panel were impressed with Tara's execution of ideas and her exploration of issues of identity, dissociation and the outsider.

The Committee praised the quality of work produced by NUA students in a difficult year of study with covid restrictions meaning limited access to workshops. The students had shown perseverance and determination in adapting to these circumstances.

Special mention must go to Rebecca Foster-Clarke and Ellen Sibley whose work was highly commended by the Committee.

Welcome to nca21

Welcome to **nca21** presented by Norfolk Contemporary Art Society ncas in Norwich Cathedral's Hostry.

The exhibition is the sixth in the series of open art exhibitions featuring works by members of **ncas**. The works in this years exhibition cover a wide range of media, from painting, printmaking, collage, drawing, sculpture, photography, video, digital and mixed media. This year we will present the exhibition **ncas** prize of £500 for an outstanding work and the Adnams prize, comprising a selection of Adnams products, to the most distinguished work. We have invited Amanda Geitner Director of EAAF to select the prizewinners.

ncas is a charitable association founded in 1956. With almost 400 members, our raison d'etre is to promote contemporary visual art, with a particular emphasis given to artists living and working in the region. We have strong associations with the Norwich Castle Museum & Art Gallery and with Norwich University of the Arts, that we are keen to build upon. Post-covid, young and emerging artists and curators will need our support and encouragement, perhaps more than ever. Art has taught us in the last two years that it can act as a universal symbol of hope, it offers individual moments of reflection, and creates support and much-needed daily distraction from the new challenges that confront us. We encourage you to enjoy the exhibition, purchase a work that takes your eye, tell your friends and perhaps join the society.

The selection process

The works in the exhibition were selected by an independent panel of experienced art professionals, chaired by Selwyn Taylor (deputy chair **ncas**). We are very grateful to the panel members for the critical insights and vision that enabled them to shape a distinctive and coherent exhibition. The panel comprised Rosy Gray, Curator of Modern and Contemporary Art at Norwich Castle Museum & Gallery, Lee Grandjean, Sculptor and former Senior Tutor at the Royal College of Art and Carl Rowe, Artist and former Associate Professor in Fine Art at Norwich University of the Arts. The panel had the daunting task of selecting from over 240 works submitted by 95 artists. The selection process was anonymous. In total 52 works by 46 of the artists were selected, leading to the exhibition you now see.

The exhibition highlights both the diversity and the innovative quality of contemporary work currently being produced in Norfolk, as well as reflecting just some of the artistic excellence and themes characteristic of the region.




Rose H Davies

The abandoned piece had a mysterious, untold history with its form charred, changed and reduced by fire. Its unknown narrative was captured on the fragile surface with a surprising iridescence and delicacy. The process of bronze casting has transformed the fragile nature of the timber, capturing a moment in time, into an element of

Alex's practice has focused on tree portraits. Over these last 18 months she has spent lockdown painting nature directly from her garden. 



The development of stains, burns, spills and holes are important parts of my visual language.







Recently my starting points have been either insignificant tiny models that I have made, or fragments taken from my photographs. They enable me to play with perceptions of scale and location in the drawings.


